1.0 INTRODUCTION

The mission of the Fearless Institute is to train and deploy 5000 multiplying, kingdom leaders by 2035. We are delighted that you have taken the bold step to enrol for the Leadership Bootcamp and look forward to spending the year together as we seek to raise the bar for Kingdom leadership in our nation, continent and world.

We will have the orientation class on 27th January, 8.00 am – 1.00 pm (EAT) at Mavuno Church - Hill City and online via ZOOM APPLICATION for those out of the country.

2.0 ABOUT THE COURSE

The Leadership Bootcamp runs for a duration of 11 months starting in January and ending in November.

Lectures are conducted on a designated Saturday once every month in an intensive and interactive learning environment.

2.1 ATTENDANCE OF LECTURES

Since lectures are held only once a month and the dates are scheduled at the start of the year, it is your responsibility to plan your annual schedule to ensure you attend all class sessions without fail. A record of attendance shall be kept. Missing more than two sessions will lead to discontinuation. For those outside Kenya, a class link will be shared with you to ensure you are part of the class.

2.4 THE LEARNING APPROACH

Our approach includes traditional learning methods like lectures, discussions and assignments as well as experiential learning where students will be asked to perform tasks or get into learning environments outside of their comfort zones so as to grow into the kind of leaders that we need; doers, and not just people equipped with head knowledge.

2.5 ACCOUNTABILITY GROUPS

The class will be divided into several Action Groups. Each group shall be headed by an assessor who will evaluate your progress and advise you on any challenges you may encounter during the course of the year. Be sure to direct all our inquiries to your assessor.

3.2.2 SYNOPSIS

For purposes of this course, a synopsis will be defined as a summary of the main theme of a given book, what it means for you as a leader and how you intend to apply it in your leadership journey. Unless otherwise stated, each synopsis should be a one-pager with a word count of 500 words, and a spacing of 1.5 using the Times New Roman font size 12.

3.2.3 GROUP ACTIVITY/DISCUSSIONS

For some modules, your application of the concepts of a particular book shall be evaluated through group activity/discussions. The times and structure of group discussions shall be determined and communicated by your assessor. Attendance and participation in all group activities/discussions is not optional.

3.2.4 DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF MONTHLY ASSIGNMENTS

All monthly assignments for a particular module must be submitted by 5:00 p.m. close of business the day before the next lecture session. All submissions that are received after the deadline will not be considered. All written assignments will be emailed to **fearlessinstitute@mavunochurch.org**. Please also CC your assessor in these as well as any other emails written to the institute. All assignments must be saved in this format: Assignment Code - Name (e.g. LB101 - Esther Mwikali)



3.3 YEAR-LONG ASSIGNMENTS

Below is the full list of year-long assignments; Failure to meet ALL the requirements for each of them will lead to a fail.

3.3.1 PERSONAL GROWTH ASSIGNMENTS

All leadership must start with self-leadership and personal growth. You will be required to demonstrate this through your Vision Paper. You will be required to start developing your Vision Paper and to keep refining it throughout the course of the year.

3.3.2 INFLUENCE IN WRITING

As a leader, you must influence people across time and space. One of the best ways you can do this is through writing and public speaking. You will be required to demonstrate this influence through the assignments below.

3.3.2.1. WRITE AND PUBLISH A BOOK

Your book must meet the following criteria:

- i. You can write about any topic of your choice.
- ii. The book must be published and submitted to the institute before 24th October 2024
- iii. All expenses to do with the book are to be covered by the student.
- iv. You cannot self-edit your book. You must have an editor
- v. The book must have a minimum of 50 pages.
- vi. You must be the sole author. You cannot co-author.
- vii. You must follow internationally recognized citation methods. Plagiarism will not be entertained.

3.3.2.2 WRITE A BLOG

You must write a blog at least once every fortnight so that by the time you come for each class, you will have published two blogs. The blog can be on any topic of your choice and should be on an online blog platform. Video blogs and podcasts will also be permitted although a written transcript of the content will need to be submitted for the assignment to be complete. You must write a blog at least once every fortnight. Please note that the indiscipline of writing 20 blogs in one night in November 2024 simply to meet the requirement will not be accepted. For every month, you must have written a minimum of two blogs.

3.3.2.3. PUBLIC SPEAKING ASSIGNMENT

As part of your training, you will prepare a written message that you will preach to a congregation or audience.

3.3.3. ROYAL GIFT

Part of your July assignment will be giving a royal gift to one of the students in class. This is a secret gift which they shouldn't know about, however, you can secretly ask their spouse or close friends. The idea is to get to know them better through research, prayer and interaction. There is no limit to how much you will spend, however, it is meant to minister to them.

3.3.4 MISSIONS

Missions stir us up to growth. They are concentrated times when we travel to a place outside our comfort zone to learn and serve. They stretch us in terms of fundraising before the trip and engaging outside what we are normally comfortable with. They result in tremendous growth in another culture.

3.3.4.1 LOCAL MISSION

You will be engaged in planning and executing 2 local missions throughout the year. The Goal of the local mission would be to plant a new church or to strengthen one that exists already. The local Missions will happen in April and August

3.3.4.2 ATTEND THE INTERNATIONAL MISSION

3.3.5 SERVANT LEADERSHIP

Kingdom Leadership is about serving! As Jesus taught, the greatest among you is the one who serves. As part of your training this year, you will serve your faith community in several ways

3.3.5.1 SERVE

Offer regular ministry leadership at your church campus as an associate. Sit upfront when not actively serving and armor-bear for the pastors as well as guests to the campus.

3.3.5.2. SERVE AT THE FEARLESS SUMMIT

Fearless Summit happens in August. (We will communicate the dates as soon as we get confirmation.) Please plan to be there every day of the event. You will be assigned a serving team and may be called upon to host an international guest/s of the conference at your home.

NB: The Leader will not graduate if he/she fails any of the above year-long assignments, regardless of whether he or she has performed excellently in the rest of the year-long assignments and module assignments. These five year-long assignments CANNOT FEATURE among the two fails.

4.1 TUITION FEES

The Tuition for the course is 40,000 Kenya Shillings. The tuition fees will cover class expenses i.e. facility, faculty and snacks as well as other administrative costs.

4.2 TUITION PAYMENT

All successful candidates will be required to make a downtown payment of 5000KSHS before the first class on 27th January 2024 and the remaining amount be paid in the instalments below: (Please put the details in table format)

4.4 DEADLINE FOR FINAL PAYMENT OF ALL FEES

The deadline for tuition payment is May 30th 2024.

4.5.2 OTHER BOOTCAMP COSTS

Kindly note that there are some other financial costs that the student will incur during the year.

All books for the course must be acquired and should be available on Amazon Kindle. In addition, there will be costs incurred for the local and international mission trips, Fearless Summit and gifts for fellow students. We will try to give as accurate an estimate as possible regarding what these costs will be.

TUITION: KES 40, 000/= (Can be paid in installments until end of April 2024.)

LOCAL MISSION: (March 2024)

FEARLESS SUMMIT: KES 5,000/= (July 2024)

ROYAL GIFT to be advised

INTERNATIONAL MISSION KES 80,000/= (Conference fees, flights, accommodation, meals etc.)

BOOK COSTS KES 50,000/= to 100,000/= (Design, layout, ISBN, printing.)

5.0 ASSESSMENT OF ASSIGNMENTS

All assignments will be reviewed by the Group Assessors. Written assignments are to be emailed to fearlessinstitute@mavunochurch.org and the respective assessor must be kept in copy of all emails sent to the Institute. The Group Assessors will give monthly feedback on all your assignments within 14 days of submission.

All assignments that need to be re-done will be under a two-week window, after which the late submission penalty will apply. The student is free to write to the Institute if they do not receive assessment results within the 14-day window. This email should be addressed to the 'Academic Coordinator' and sent to fearlessinstitute@mavunochurch.org. Please keep the subject as 'Delayed Assessment Feedback' for such emails.

5.1 THE ASSIGNMENT FAIL

5.1.1 GROUNDS FOR FAILING MONTHLY ASSIGNMENTS

You will have a fail in an assignment if the following happens;

1. Failure to submit a written assignment
2. Failure to attend a group discussion
3. Failure to attend a lecture session.
4. Submission of a substandard written assignment having been requested to re-do in order for you to graduate from the course, you should have no more than 2 fails for the monthly assignments

5.1.2 GROUNDS FOR FAILING YEAR-LONG ASSIGNMENTS

You will receive a fail in the year-long assignments if you do not meet ALL requirements stated in Assignment Section 3.3. These year-long Assignments CANNOT FEATURE among the two fails.

6.0 DISCONTINUATION

6.1 GROUNDS FOR DISCONTINUATION

6.1.1 NON- ATTENDANCE

You can only miss a maximum of two classes out of the 12 Institute classes. If you miss more than two classes, you will be discontinued. You will also be required to write to the institute administrator at least 48 hours before any class you are not able to attend to help us properly plan logistics.

6.1.1 MONTHLY ASSIGNMENTS

A leader can only have a maximum of two fails; any more fails will lead to discontinuation.

6.1.3 VOLUNTARY DISCONTINUATION

You may apply to leave the institute at any point during the course of the year. You must do it in writing (**by email to fearlessinstitute@mavunochurch.org**) clearly stating the reasons for your exit. You will be required to clear all unpaid tuition fees.

6.1.4 YEAR-LONG ASSIGNMENTS

If you fail any of the assignments listed in section 3.3 you will be discontinued.

7.0 GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to graduate you must have fulfilled the following requirements;

1. Full payment of tuition fees.
2. Must have attended a minimum of 10 classes.
3. Must have no more than two fails (None of the fails should be a year-long assignment.)
4. Must have passed all the pre-requisite assignments.
5. A published and printed Book (minimum of 50 pages).
6. A minimum of 12 blogs.
7. Started a discipleship group or missional community or church plant.
8. Attended the international Mission and travelled by air.
9. Attended and served on a team at Fearless Summit 2024.



8.0 APPLICATION PROCESS

Class Requirements

Applicants to the leadership course should display the following qualities:

1. Growing Christian.
2. Leading a Life Group or ministry team or a team at work.
3. Recommended by their campus pastor or senior pastor.
4. Commitment to do all the assignments.
5. Post-high school qualification is an advantage.
